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### NON-REGULAR CLASSES INVOLVING MULTIPLE DOG ENTRIES

(Stud Dog/Brood Bitch not offered at Centennial Celebration Show)

**STUD DOG CLASS:** For Stud Dogs and two of their get. Stud Dogs must be entered in the Stud Dog Class and must be shown in the ring with their Get. The owner of the Stud Dog need not necessarily be owner of the Get. Get only to be judged, based on the merits of the Get. While the merits of the Stud Dog are not to be considered in the placement of the entry, the Stud Dog must be examined to determine if it has a condition that would require its disqualification or excusal under the Dog Show Rules, AKC policy, or the standard for its breed. Get must be entered in a regular class, Best of Breed competition, or some other non-regular class.

**BROOD BITCH CLASS:** Same as for the Stud Dog except substitute Brood Bitch for Stud Dog and Produce for Get.

**BRACE CLASS (OESCA ONLY):** Two dogs of identical ownership. The dogs comprising a Brace MUST be named at the time of entry. In making entries for "Brace Class Only" full particulars MUST be given for each dog on individual entry forms. An entry form for a dog entered in a Regular Class or for "Best of Breed Competition" and entered as part of a Brace MUST be marked accordingly in the space provided for Additional Classes. "Brace Class." If more than one Brace is entered by same owner, dogs comprising EACH BRACE must be so designated – "Brace No. 1," Brace No. 2," etc.

**TEAM CLASS:** Four dogs of identical ownership. The dogs comprising a Team MUST be named at the time of entry. In making entries for "Team Class Only" full particulars MUST be given for each dog on individual entry forms. An entry form for a dog entered in a Regular Class or for "Best of Breed Competition" and entered as part of a Team MUST be marked accordingly in the space provided for Additional Classes. "Team Class." If more than one Team is entered by same owner, dogs comprising EACH TEAM must be so designated – "Team No. 1," Team No. 2," etc.

*NOTE: As the judge's decision in the Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Brace and Team Classes is based on the merits of more than one dog/bitch, no one of the dogs/bitches making up the entry judged first in these classes will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed by virtue of having won this class.*

### **From Baltimore (South)**

Take I-83 north to the Rt. 30 exit in York, PA. Take Rt. 30 east to the Lincoln Highway exit (a continuation of Rt. 30). Turn left on Lincoln Highway and go southeast. The hotel will be on the right.

### **From Harrisburg (North)**

### **From Pittsburgh (West)**

### **From New York**

## Alternate methods to get to the Lancaster Host Hotel

### If you are flying into New York:

There is train service from New York City to Lancaster through Philadelphia. The ride from NYC Penn Station to Lancaster costs \$50.00-\$58.00. There are about 7 weekday trains per day that require no change of trains in Philadelphia. (Please be aware that the US is still in the Neanderthal Age when it comes to pets – dogs are **NOT** allowed on trains!) On weekends there are 4 or 5 with no change of trains, and about 3 that do require a change. The uninterrupted trip takes just under 3 hours from NYC to Lancaster. You can see the schedule at <http://www.amtrak.com/servlet/ContentServer?pagename=Amtrak/HomePage>

The station code for New York is “nyp” and for Lancaster “Inc”. The service from JFK Airport NY Penn Station is via bus and is not frequent. You can also see that on the above website (station code “jfk”).

Once you are at the station in Lancaster you are 15 minutes from the hotel, and the hotel runs a free shuttle service. You just need to let them know 24 hours in advance when you are arriving and they will pick you up. There are also taxis there if you prefer.

The train would certainly be the most attractive option if there are only 1 or 2 in your party. If there are 4 or 5, you may look into renting a car. But car rentals in NYC are obscenely expensive, to say nothing of driving on unknown interstate highways and possibly ending up in Nova Scotia! Car travel from NYC to Lancaster would also take considerably longer than 3 hours.

### If you are flying into Philadelphia:

Philadelphia is certainly the **BEST** airport to fly into if you do not need a car (for dogs, ridiculous amounts of luggage, tons of gifts and items for the OES auctions, etc.). If you fly into Philadelphia, there is a train at the airport that will get you to the Amtrak station in about 20 minutes for a few dollars and then to the train to Lancaster. (See the above for the link for the Amtrak schedule out of Philadelphia to Lancaster.) Once in Lancaster, the hotel will pick you up in their shuttle, and you will not really need a car. If you want to go on an excursion into the countryside, there probably will be a person with a car who might oblige, or there might be a cheaper daily car rental in Lancaster that will take you where you want to go.

### If you are flying into Baltimore/Washington International:

This airport might be the best choice if you absolutely *must* have a rental car or if the fare is soooo much cheaper than that to Philadelphia that it will pay for your rental car. Forget about getting from Baltimore to Lancaster via public transportation — there is no direct bus, and the train will just route you through Philadelphia anyway.

### If you are flying into any of the Washington, DC airports:

The first thing you should know is, “*Don’t!*” These airports are the farthest away and would *require* a car rental or about a six hour train ride (again through Philadelphia). There is really no good reason to fly here unless you want to visit friends or sightsee in the DC area beforehand or if somehow you have won a free plane trip to DC!

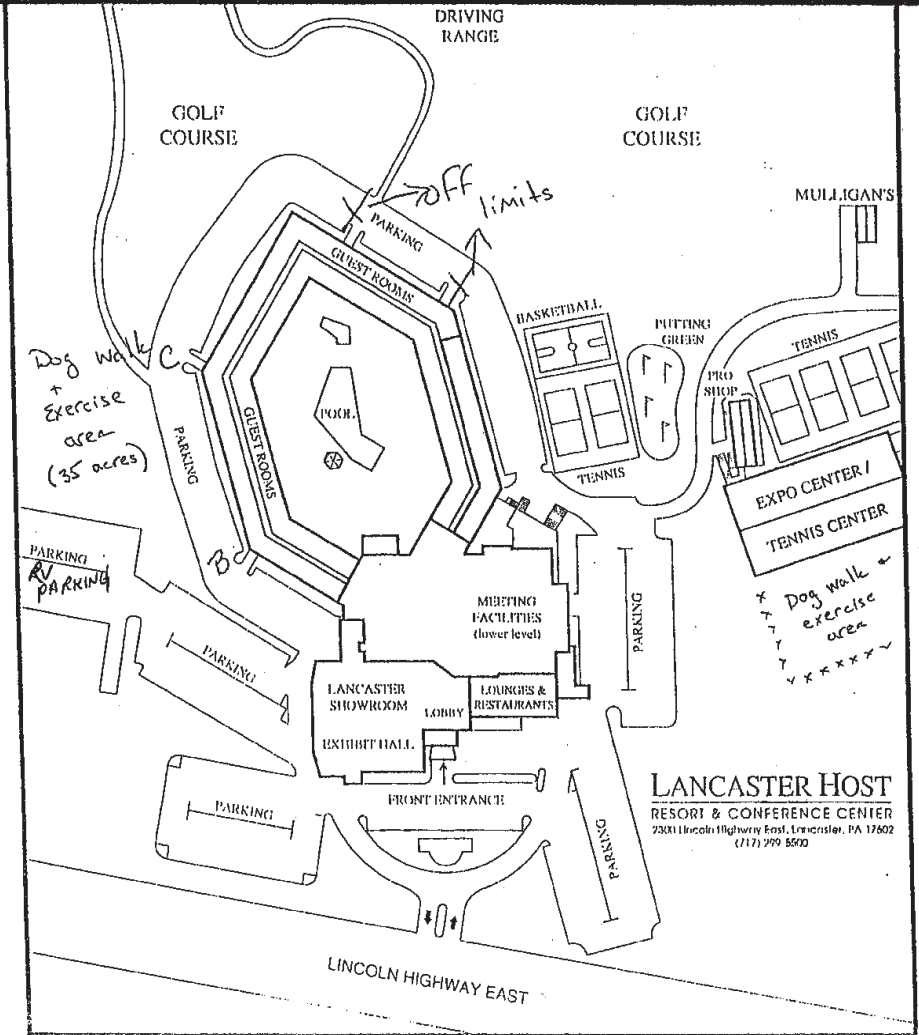
